#### Introduction

## Corona and the world.

On December 31, 2019, an outbreak of a new pneumonia with a yet unknown cause was confirmed in Wuhan, China. In January 2020, the World Health Organization proposed the name COVID-19 for the infectious disease. In February 2020, the disease evolved into an epidemic and eventually a global pandemic known as "Corona."

In numerous countries around the world, there were massive disruptions to everyday life as the pandemic unfold. The overall social impact of the COVID-19 pandemic includes the economic crisis of 2020-2021. School closures, isolations, curfews: Children and young people are particularly affected by the restrictions. That's why it's important to us to give them a voice. "How has Corona changed my life?" is what we asked children and young people. Children and young people between the ages of 5 and 18 from Bangladesh, Bolivia, Germany, Namibia, and Spain sent us their contributions. In this exhibition, we see their artistic answers. The overall winners from four categories are published here. These include the best group work and the best work from the different age categories.

My name is Ela Ekizoglu and i am 15 years old Grade:10.4 I drew this picture in Arts class in english.






#### "HOW CORONA CHANGED MY LIFE

Whilst we have to adapt to ever changing rules, regulations and therefore new conditions, we constantly step out of our comfort zones making us clearly more flexible. Due to these conditions, we develop a deeper sense of compassion for one another and our empathy grows. Additionally, our appreciation levels expand for our fellow human beings. Beauty salons, restaurants, shops and schools closed again. It was the beginning of the second lockdown. Christmas, new year, my birthday and carnival never been so boring before. The only good new was that the corona vaccination finally started. After a few months the graduate classes could go to school again, like me. In school we need to get 2 times a week tested on corona. And now everything is getting more and more worse, we have an curfew. I went 10 years to school and now I couldn't even have an closing trip or an big graduation party.


